Final Judgment

In the First Reading, we hear about a time of great distress. This passage tells us about the final judgment, where those who are wise will shine brightly, and those who lead others to righteousness will be like stars forever. It encourages us to live wisely and help others follow God's ways. It reminds us that we will face a final judgment. Our actions and choices matter, and we should strive to live according to God's will. We are called to lead others to righteousness and to be a light in the world. As we reflect on this, we should examine our lives. Are we living wisely? Are we helping others find their way to God? This reading challenges us to be mindful of our actions and their impact on others.

Christ's Sacrifice

In the Second Reading we learn about Jesus' sacrifice. Jesus offered one sacrifice for sins and then sat down at the right hand of God. His sacrifice made us holy, and there is no need for further offerings for sin. This passage shows us the completeness of Jesus' sacrifice. He has done everything needed for our forgiveness. This should fill us with gratitude and give us confidence in our salvation. Reflecting on this, we can see how much God loves us. Jesus' sacrifice was once and for all. We should live in a way that honors this gift, knowing that we are forgiven and made holy through Him.

Hope in Tribulation

In the Gospel reading, Jesus speaks about the coming of the Son of Man during a time of great tribulation. He describes signs in the heavens and on earth, but He also assures us that His words will never pass away. This passage reminds us of the hope we have even in difficult times. Jesus' words give us hope and strength. Even when things seem chaotic and uncertain, we know that He is in control. His promise to return gives us a future to look forward to. Reflecting on this Gospel, we can find comfort in Jesus' words. We are reminded that no matter how hard things get, we have hope in His return.
